#### PRODUCTION NOTES

The woodland stage setting for this show can easily be adapted for any season.

The basic set should include two large tree trunks made from sturdy card, set to either side of stage. The tree trunks should have opening doors through which characters can enter the stage area. One of these two working doors has a sign on it saying 'FOR SALE - 3 bedroom Tree Trunk - Mushroom Estates – 0164 37285'.

The rest of the stage set and backdrop is up to you and your imagination! Add bright flowers and greenery for a summer setting; daffodils, blossom, nests and baby birds for a spring scene; orange, brown and gold leaves and spider's webs for autumn; snow and bare 'frosted' branches for winter. You can even add tinsel, glitter, fairy lights and a Christmas tree for a Christmas show.

#### Note on costumes!

I have not included great detail on costumes as schools work in different ways, some producing costumes en masse, others leaving individual costumes to parents (from whom I always find the most original ideas originate!).

However, a colourful array of pixie hats, fairy tutus and animal and bird masks or face paints are definitely going to be in order. Have fun!

#### **IDEAS FOR THE 'PIXIELAND BAND'**

Several of the songs and dances have specific instrumental ideas written for them in the 'Piano Scores' book. However, depending on the age and experience of the children, and skill of the teacher, the instrumental work may be simplified to suit. For example, it works well if the children play along with the CD. Get them to listen to the percussion sounds and rhythms used in the accompaniments and match what they hear.

'What A Great Day In The Woods' Tambourines, jingle bells, maracas (to shake

to the pulse in chorus only).

'Lord & Lady Wood-Pidge' Snare drum solo, triangles, cymbals (see

suggestions in 'piano scores' book).

'Goblin Man!' Tambourines, maracas (to shake to the pulse

in chorus only - plus drums to play to rhythm of words 'Goblin Man, run if you can...

'Have You Ever Been To A Fairy Party?' Jingle bells, maracas to gently shake to pulse

throughout.

'Pass The Pixie Parcel' Wood blocks and maracas gently tap/shake

to the pulse throughout, but play to rhythm of words 'What could be inside?' or equivalent

at end of each section.

'Goblin Man! (Reprise 1)' As 'Goblin Man!' above.

'Dance Of The Woodland Animals' Flute/recorders (quite advanced - optional),

alto xylophones, metallophone/bass xylophone, bongos, cabasa, taiko drum (or other low (preferably two-tone) drum eg.

congas.

'Goblin Man! (Reprise 2)' As 'Goblin Man!' above.

'The Pixieland Band Waltz'

Alto xylophones, metallophone/bass xylophone, variety of light percussion (jingle bells, small wood blocks, maracas, tapping sticks etc.) The Goblin Man's bass drum interrupts this piece, so the percussion must be light for the drum to have a comparatively loud effect!

'Good Friend'

Triangles, Indian bells, lightly 'ting' on 1<sup>st</sup> beat of the bar throughout.

'All's Well That Ends Well!'

Children should join in with the 'clap' and 'stamp' rhythms in this song. (For younger children, you may find that missing out the 'stamp' patterns altogether is preferable!) Add lighter, higher percussion sounds to the 'clap' rhythms, and drums and lower sounds to the 'stamp' rhythms.

Until they are required on stage as 'The Pixieland Band', the musicians should sit off the stage area, in front of it, to one side. (It is preferable that they sit together in one group rather than split to either side of the stage, so that they can hear each other properly.) It is also always a good idea to have them sitting on PE mats so that the instruments do not make intrusive banging noises on the floor as they are put down!

SCENE ONE: THE FAIRY WOODLANDS

(Fairies, Pixies and Woodland Creatures act out their daily routines around the stage as they sing this song, making shoes, creating flowers, playing chase etc. (For a Christmas performance, Pixies could pretend to make or stack colourful, shiny presents.) These movements could be combined into a dance.)

(A door opens in the tree trunk RT. Lord and Lady Wood-Pidge step out.)

**LADY:** (With a grand, proud voice) Did I hear our names spoken?

**BEARDY:** Yes, Lady Wood-Pidge. We were just saying how happy we are to live

here in Fairy Dell.

LORD: (Strutting up and down, ruffling his feathers proudly) Well, it's a

rather exclusive area, you know. No riff-raff round here!

SWEETY: (Looking at tree LT of stage with 'FOR SALE' sign.) | see they've

still not sold that tree trunk yet.

**EDDIE:** It must be very expensive.

**SQUEAK:** Yes, it is! I've been inside! It's got a balcony at the top...

ALL: Oooooh!

**SQUEAK:** ...and a root-level swimming pool!

ALL: Ooooooh!

**BLACKBIRD:** I'm surprised that Lord and Lady Wood-Pidge don't buy it!

**ROBIN:** They're too fat! They'd break the branches!

**LADY:** (*Indignantly*) How rude! Anyway, our tree is far superior... (*Turning*)

to Lord Wood-Pidge) ...isn't it, dear?

**LORD:** Absolutely. It's an oak you know; only the best for us.

Christmas performance, "presents to make before Christmas")

(The others nod their heads in agreement and start to go back to their activities. Some birds and animals leave the stage to create space. Suddenly, off stage RT, a loud angry voice breaks the happy atmosphere. All stop work and look worried.)

GOBLIN MAN: (Off stage, shouting) I want a house! I want a big house! I want the

biggest house in Fairy Dell!

(On storms the Goblin Man, followed closely by 'pixie estate agent', Mr Mushroom. The Goblin Man stamps around the stage and Fairies and Pixies back away. He and Mr Mushroom stop by the 'FOR SALE' tree trunk).

**MR MUSHROOM:** Oh, yes sir, yes sir! This is the finest house in Fairy Dell!

**GOBLIN MAN:** (Loudly) Have you got the key?

MR MUSHROOM: ...it has a tree-top balcony, and a root-level swimming pool...

**GOBLIN MAN:** (*More annoyed*) Have you got the key?!

MR MUSHROOM: ...it is a very good price too...

GOBLIN MAN: (Stamps his foot) HAVE... YOU... GOT... THE... KEY?!!

MR MUSHROOM: (Petrified) Of course, sir! (Pulls out of his clothing a big key) Here

it is! Would sir like a guided tour?

GOBLIN MAN: (Snatches key, furious) NO!! I WOULDNT!!

(The Goblin Man opens the door, goes in and slams the door behind him. Silence. Mr Mushroom looks worriedly at the Fairies and creatures who watch aghast. He knocks on the door.)

MR MUSHROOM: (Sheepish) Hello! Can you hear me, Mr Goblin?

**GOBLIN MAN:** (From inside) NO!

MR MUSHROOM: Can I come in... Please?

GOBLIN MAN: (From inside) GO AWAY!

MR MUSHROOM: But you haven't paid, sir.

GOBLIN MAN: (From inside) Ha! Ha! HA!

MR MUSHROOM: (Turns to others, bewildered) Oh, dear. What am I going to do?

(Petal comes and puts her arm around poor Mr Mushroom.)

**PETAL:** Don't worry, Mr Mushroom. He'll soon be on his way. He's just having

a look... (Uncertain) I'm sure of it...

**LORD:** I hope you're right, Petal! We don't want *him* as a neighbour!

(The Woodland Folk make their way off stage, (off LT, RT and front) sadly discussing the situation. Once they are gone, the door to the Goblin Man's tree trunk opens cautiously, and he sneaks out.)

**GOBLIN MAN:** Ha ha! A new neighbourhood to annoy! Fantastic!

(He whistles loudly on a little whistle or whistling instrument. Song introduction begins. From either side of stage dance a motley crew of strange looking Goblins. They become backing dancers and singers.)
